It is a very great pleasure to invite you to this year's Southern Cathedrals Festival. For us in Winchester, the most significant anniversary in 2017 is that of Jane Austen, who died in 1817 and is buried in the North Nave Aisle of the Cathedral.

Musical anniversaries this year include Francis Jackson, E W Naylor, Louis Vierne and, from an earlier period, Antonio Lotti and Claudio Monteverdi. Our closing concert will be a performance of the latter's magnificent Vespers of 1610, which will involve all of the three Cathedral choirs, and will be performed using the magnificent space of the Cathedral.

On a lighter note, this year sees the return of the traditional Festival Fringe, when the Winchester Lay Clerks and friends will be providing some suitable entertainment, under the title, 'Responses and Irresponsibility'.

The Southern Cathedrals Festival celebrates the friendships and sense of community that exists between our three cathedrals. It will be a delight for our choirs and organists to be working together, and to welcome friends from near and far to join us at services and concerts.

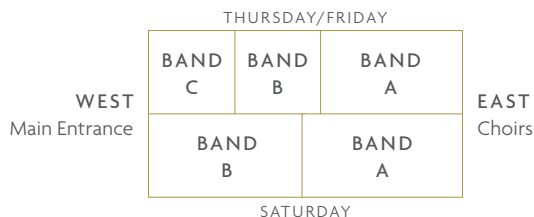

Patrons have priority booking until 15 May and must book using a booking form.

In person The Box Office is located in the Cathedral Visitors' Centre opposite the main entrance and normally open Monday – Friday, 10.00am to 4.30pm; Saturday 11.00am – 3.00pm.

On the door Tickets will be available on the door from 45 minutes before the start time. However, you are strongly advised to book in advance for all SCF events.

Payment We accept all major debit and credit cards (not AMEX).

Postage & Collection There is a postage charge of 75p per order, although you may collect your tickets when the Box Office is open or on the door, (advised for international visitors).

Booking fees There is a booking fee for each telephone and online transaction of £2.50.
